Attend to the basic first aid, medication and paperwork needs in regard to health of the participants and staff for the NYLT session.

Job Description

ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- Maintain an inventory of supplies in the health area.
- Assist the Adult Health Aid in performing first aid on campers and staff.
- Respond to needs for medical around camp.
- Assist the Adult Health Aide and Tahosa Health Officer as needed.
- Call the Tahosa Health Officer if assistance is needed, for major injuries or medical needs, and emergencies.
- Alert the TH Health Officer about campers or staff who carry life-saving medication(s) and those that may present a risk for injury or illness.
- Be familiar with camp emergency procedures.
- Model the core learning and leadership messages of the NYLT syllabus.
- Report all issues with participants or staff to the NYLT Scoutmaster or TH Camp Director as necessary.
- Other duties as assigned.

CERTIFICATIONS & REQUIRED TRAINING

REQUIRED FOR THE JOB

- Must be able to read, speak and write the English language
- Must be able to work outdoors at an elevation of 9,000+ feet above sea level in varying weather conditions
- Must be able to respond to emergencies around camp
- Must be able to pass a background check from the TRAILS database, CBI and the FBI
- Must be a member of the Boy Scouts of America
- Must be 18 years of age or older
